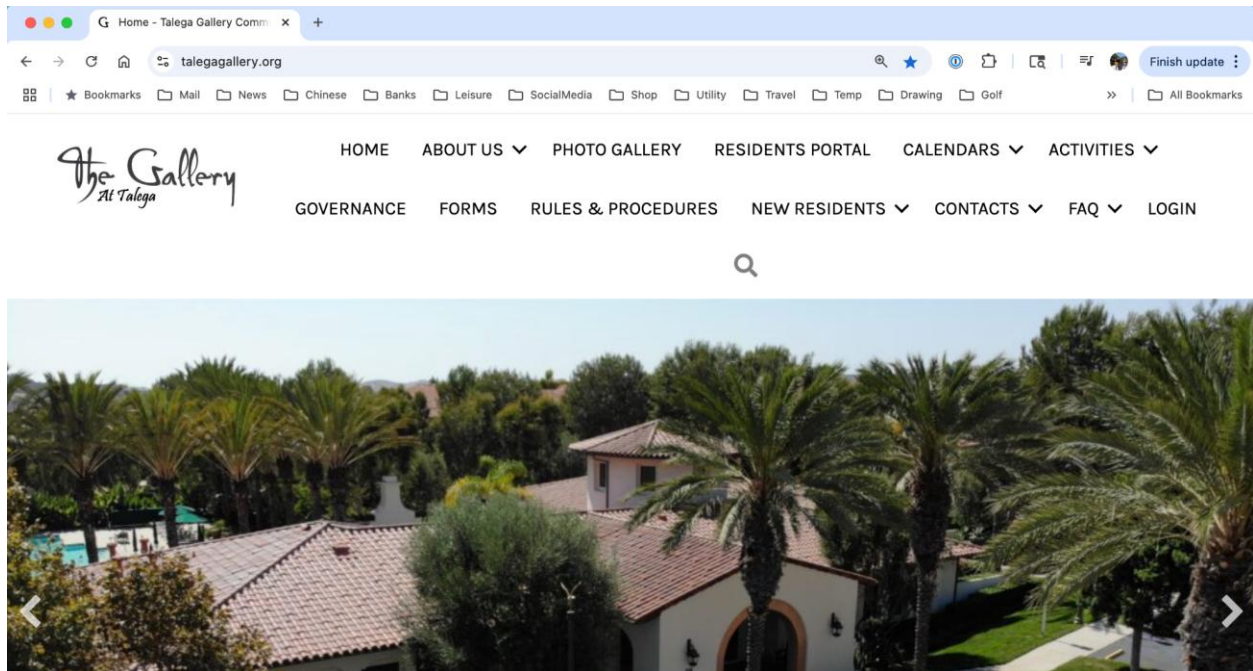


Bookmarks

- For Chrome on Mac desktop

When you open a page on Chrome, for example:



On the top, there are several icons. We'll use those icon names in this article:

1. "Previous" icon "<" takes you to the previous tab
2. "Next" icon ">" takes you to the next tab
3. "Add Bookmark" icon - a "star" icon, for adding the current page to the bookmark
4. "Tab Search" icon - An Rectangular with a magnified glass, for view the open tab list and recent closed tabs
5. "More" icon - the three dots (vertically lined up) on the top right, giving you more options, selecting "Bookmarks and list" will lead you to a set of options.

Bookmarks can be well organized, and don't really burn your iPhone resources. Just like a file system, you can have folders, subfolders to manage bookmarks.

Manage Bookmarks

- How to see your bookmarks - On any Chrome page, click on the "More" icon, the three dots (vertically lined up), select "Bookmarks and Lists".

- How to add a bookmark - On the page you want to add to the bookmark, there are several options:
 - Select the “Add Bookmark” icon (star)
 - Drag the URL to bookmark folders
 - Select “More” (three dots), then “Bookmarks and Lists”, then “Bookmark this tap”
- How to open the Bookmark manager - Under the URL, there is a bookmark bar, lining up the bookmarks, or the bookmark folders, on the left of the bookmark bar, there is a star (filled) with text “Bookmarks”. Click on it will open a tab with all your bookmarks. The you can:
 - Create a new bookmark folder
 - Edit a bookmark
 - Move a bookmark from one folder to another

- How to edit a bookmark - Refer to create a bookmark folder. same as create a bookmark folder, select “Edit bookmark”
- How to move a bookmark - Refer to “edit a bookmark” above
- How to delete a bookmark - Open the “Side Bar”, select “Bookmarks”. Go to the folder or subfolder, find the bookmark you want to delete, wipe to the left, select delete.
