
Tabs

For Chrome on Mac Desktop

When you open a page on Chrome, for example:



On the top, there are several icons. We'll use those icon names in this article:

- 1. "Previous" icon "<-" takes you to the previous tab
- 2. "Nest" icon "->" takes you to the next tab
- 3. "Add Bookmark" icon a "star" icon, for adding the current page to the bookmark
- 4. "Tab Search" icon An Rectangular with a magnified glass, for view the open tab list and recent closed tabs
- 5. "More" icon the three dots (vertically lined up) on the top right, giving you more options, selecting "Bookmarks and list" will lead you to a set of options.

Click on the "Tab Search" icon (An Rectangular with a magnified glass) will take you to the list of your Chrome tabs. If the # is larger than 20, you probably better do something. Too many tabs will impact performance, and consume memory space, but not as bad as on mobile devices.

Manage Tabs

- How to see your tabs Select "Tab Search".
- How to select a tab (making it active) Select the tab.
- How to create a new tab Select "More" (the three vertically lined dots), add a new tab.
- How to close a tab -"Tab Search", find the tab, click on the "x" of that tab.

More advanced topic: Tab Groups. You can organize your tabs into tab Groups, such as "Sports", "Travel" "Health", etc. That way, you can store more tabs but still have easy access.
