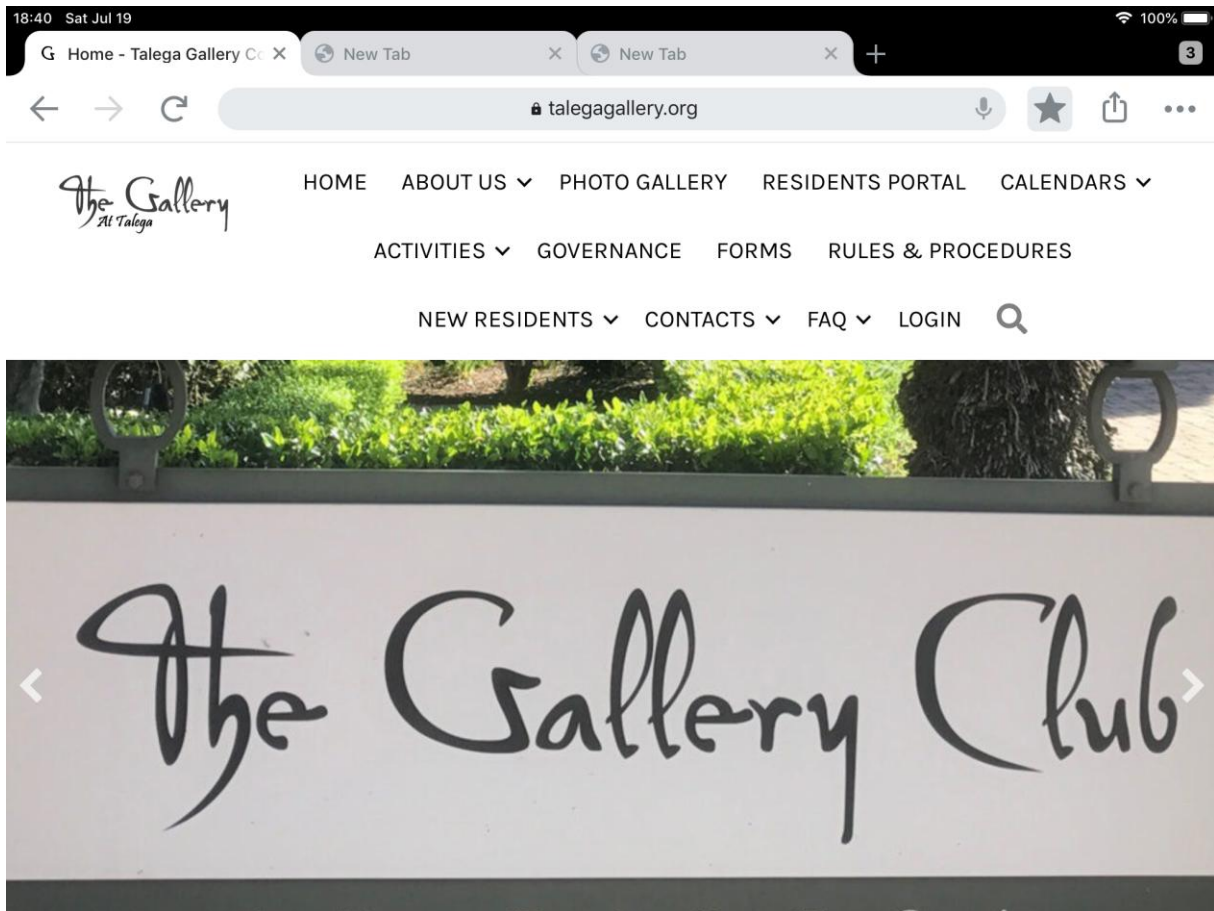


Tabs

For Chrome on iPad

When you open a page on Chrome, for example:



On the top, there are several icons on the bottom. We'll use those icon names in this article:

1. "Previous" icon "<-" takes you to the previous tab
2. "Next" icon - ">" takes you to the next tab
3. "All Tabs" - a square with a number in it, at the tip right of the browser. The number is the total number of active tabs
4. "Add Bookmark" icon - a "star" icon, for adding the current page to the bookmark
5. "Action" icon - An open square with an upward arrow, takes you to various actions for the current webpage, such as copy, airdrop, etc.
6. "More" icon - the three dots on the top right, giving you many more actions, one of them is "Recent Tabs". Selecting it will let you see your recent active tabs.

Manage Tabs

- How to see your tabs - Usually all tabs are visible from the browser (on the top of the browser). If you have too many active tabs, clicking on the “All Tabs” icon will show all your tabs in thumbnails.
- How to select a tab (making it active) - Select the tab.
- How to create a new tab - Click on the “+” on the top of the browser
- How to close a tab - Click on the “x” of the tab, either from the top of the browser, or from the “all tabs” thumbnails.

Similar to Safari “Private Tabs”, Chrome has “incognito tabs”, which will not track your browsing history, cookies, etc.
